INFORMED CONSENT

The Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies has the general responsibility of regulating the practice of licensed psychologists, licensed social workers, licensed professional counselors, licensed marriage and family therapists, licensed school psychologists practicing outside the school setting, licensed or certified addiction counselors, and unlicensed individuals who practice psychotherapy. The agency within the Department that has responsibility specifically for licensed and Registered Psychotherapists is the Department of Regulatory Agencies, Mental Health Section, 1560 Broadway, Suite 1350, Denver, Colorado 80202, (303) 894-7800 (per, DORA.com).

Client Rights and Important Information:

- a. You are entitled to receive information from me about my methods of therapy, the techniques I use, the duration of your therapy and related fees. Please ask if you would like to receive this information.
- b. You can seek a second opinion from another therapist or terminate therapy at any time.
- c. In a professional relationship (client/ counselor) sexual intimacy between a therapist and a client is never appropriate. If sexual intimacy occurs, it should be reported to the Department of Regulatory Agencies, Mental Health Section.
- d. In most cases, the information provided by and to a client during therapy sessions is legally confidential if the therapist is a licensed psychologist, licensed social worker, licensed professional counselor, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed or certified addiction counselor, or an Registered Psychotherapist. In the exceptional case where certain legalities arise, the therapist/

clinician may disclose to the proper authorities a client's statement to self harming, or a threat of harm to another.

- e. Information disclosed to a licensed psychologist, licensed social worker, licensed professional counselor, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed or certified addiction counselor, or an Registered Psychotherapist is privileged communication and cannot be disclosed in any court of competent jurisdiction in the State of Colorado without the consent of the person to whom the testimony sought relates.

These exceptions to the general rule of legal confidentiality are listed and explained in the Colorado statutes (C.R.S. 12-43-218). You should be aware that provisions concerning disclosure of confidential communications shall not apply to any delinquency or criminal proceedings, except as provided in C.R.S. 13-90-107.

A General Description of Mental Health Titles

-Registered psychotherapist is a psychotherapist listed in the State's database and is authorized by law to practice psychotherapy in Colorado but is not licensed by the state and is not required to satisfy any standardized educational or testing requirements to obtain a registration from the state.

-Certified Addiction Counselor I (CAC I) must be a high school graduate, complete required training hours and 1,000 hours of supervised experience.

-Certified Addiction Counselor II (CAC II) must complete additional required training hours and 2,000 hours of supervised experience.

-Certified Addiction Counselor III (CAC III) must have a bachelors degree in behavioral health, complete additional required training hours and 2,000 hours of supervised experience.

-Licensed Addiction Counselor must have a clinical masters degree and meet the CAC III requirements.

-Licensed Social Worker must hold a masters degree in social work.

-Psychologist Candidate, a Marriage and Family Therapist Candidate, and a Licensed Professional Counselor Candidate must hold the necessary licensing degree and be in the process of completing the required supervision for licensure.

-Licensed Clinical Social Worker, a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, and a Licensed Professional Counselor must hold a masters degree in their profession and have two years of post-masters supervision.

- Licensed Psychologist must hold a doctorate degree in psychology and have one year of post- doctoral supervision.
